Dress and Behavior – For guidelines follow the *Church General Handbook*, the *YW Camp Guide* and *For the Strength of Youth*

NOT PERMITTED AT CAMP LOMIA

- Dogs-Pets-Horses
- Only service dogs, licensed and wearing the appropriate vest, are allowed
- Firearms, BB/airsoft/paint guns,
- Motorcycles, Bikes,
- Fireworks, ATVs, UTVs*

25 MPH speed limit on Pine Creek Canyon Rd.

10 MPH speed limit on the dirt roads when entering, exiting and within the camp

VEHICLES REMAIN IN CAMP - Bring all food and equipment needed when you arrive, so you do not need to make trips into town.

A LEADER, WITH KNOWLEDGE OF YOUR CAMP PLANS MUST BE THE FIRST TO ARRIVE... AND THE LAST TO LEAVE CAMP.

THE CAMP SUPPLIES THE FOLLOWING:

- Restroom and kitchen soaps, paper towels and cleaners
- Toilet paper
- Hand soap – kitchen and restrooms
- Paper hand towels for cleaning
- Body wash and shampoo in showers
- 33-gal plastic trash bags
- Cleaning cloths
- Small bags for toilet stalls
- Brooms, mops, buckets
- Bowl brushes
- Dish cloths
- Dish soap
- Disinfectant cleaner – kitchen & restroom
- Laundry soap for dish cloths

ATV/UTV/GOLF CART

Your group may bring ONE golf cart or similar vehicle *for adult use only.* Children and youth are not to drive be given rides around the camp unless they are injured. This vehicle is only for those who have a disability or are otherwise unable to walk about the camp. **No vehicle is to exceed the 10-mph speed limit.**

ORIENTATION

When you arrive, missionaries will meet with your **whole group** for a brief welcome and orientation. (See “Arrival and Departure” guidelines for meeting locations.) Following the orientation, the missionaries will also meet with at least **one specific person you have assigned to be familiarized with cleaning**

policies, supplies & dispensers **and with your cooking crew** to explain kitchen procedures and checkout instructions.

PRIOR TO LEAVING CAMP

A leader of your group AND a kitchen leader must check with the Camp Missionaries for inspection and permission to leave.

EMERGENCY PLAN

Emergency Pouch - As soon as possible, each cabin leader should fill out the form found in the pouch located in their cabin/addie/room. **List the name of everyone sleeping in that cabin** and rehang. When an alarm is sounded, everyone in camp must proceed to the designated area for their camp and await further instruction.

The cabin leader must retrieve the pouch, go to that area & account for the girls in her cabin.

The Camp has 3 Fire alarms

- **Main Camp Lodge** - Inside dining room by main double doors
- **Orchard Camp Kitchen** - Inside kitchen by East Door
- **Rimview Camp Kitchen** - Inside kitchen by West Door

Fire extinguishers are in each building, cabin, and room, also on the outside of each kitchen structure near the barbecues. These are not toys. The stake/ward/group will be charged a \$20 replacement fee for each extinguisher misused.

Use of vehicles during emergency - When an alarm is sounded go to your camps evacuation area and follow the missionary's instructions. **No private vehicles are to leave camp** to ensure roads are clear for Emergency Vehicles.

TRASH DISPOSAL

The amount of and cost of disposing of the trash left by YW Camps has become unmanageable. To better control this problem:

AFTER MEAL SNACKS

Each camper will scrape leftovers and toss napkins and utensils into the garbage can. On a table set next to the can, stack their plates/bowls, one on top of the other and stack their cups into each other. Conserving space this way, the campers crew can then put the trash into the can/dumpsters.

TRASH

All props, program debris, cabin/addie/tent decorations and signs must be taken back down the hill with you and disposed of at home. No exceptions, you got it up the hill, please take it back down the hill!

ERECTING CHALLENGE COURSES

Erecting any structure **requires prior approval** by the agent stake for the camp. **A written description and specs must be submitted to the Camp Directors at least 6 weeks before** your arrival at the Camp.

CAMPFIRES

No campfires without first receiving permission from missionaries. The Forest Service determines the fire danger level. **When the threat is high, only propane stoves are allowed (no coal briquettes or wood).** When the Forest Service allows wood or charcoal fires, only the main fire rings at each camp may be used. **No campfires elsewhere in camp.**

BARBAQUE GRILLS

All camps have two 44" built-in BBQ grills. They are fueled with propane provided by the camp. Strikers are also provided. **Please clean after use.**

CONSERVE WATER

Please limit showers to **one 3-minute shower** per person per stay.

CAMP IMPROVEMENT SERVICE PROJECTS

We appreciate your desire to maintain and improve the Camp, however, **no service project is to be undertaken without prior approval from the Camp Directors or Missionaries before your group arrives.**

WI-FI

There is no Wi-Fi access anywhere in the Camp.

SOUND SYSTEM/DIGITAL PIANO

Main Camp - A sound system, like those in our chapels, has been installed in the stage area. Use carefully and responsibly. It includes a microphone with a stand and mounted speakers. There is also a drop-down screen. An acoustic and digital piano are available. See Camp Missionaries for use.

Rimview Camp & Orchard Camp - A microphone, speakers and projection screen and necessary cords are available. Please protect from the elements. Digital pianos are also available. See Camp Missionaries for use.

PROGRAMS

Prior to camp, coordinate with the other groups if your program needs a quieter atmosphere, but remember, this is an outdoor camp, sounds carry & each group's activities are important. Always be mindful of our neighbors.

RESTROOMS

Only toilet paper goes in the toilets - no feminine products, paper towels, newspapers, grease or garbage. Sinks have soap dispensers. Showers have body wash/shampoo dispensers. Cleaning supplies and instructions and are found in each bathroom. Supervise children if you have given them this task. Often, they do not know how to clean properly.

QUIET HOURS

Between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. Dances and **usage of sound systems must end by 10:00 PM.** Horns, gongs, sirens, etc. are not permitted at any time. Be considerate of neighbors when signaling wake-up or gathering times.

DECORATING LODGE, CABINS AND RIMVIEW TENTS

Lodge-Nothing is to be attached to the outside lodge walls except in the stage area, *where there are wires hung for suspending banners, etc.* **No staples, tacks or tape-never, ever.**

CABINS/ADDIES-Here, push pins and tacks may be used to hang decorations from the outside of the cabins, **(No Tape of Any Kind-never, ever!)** but **the tacks and push pins must be removed when the decorations are taken down.** This usually requires tools to pry them out, so the cabin leaders or a specific committee should bring those tools and see that the offending staples/tacks are removed before your group leaves camp.

RIMVIEW TENTS-There are eyelets at the outside corners of the tents from which light ropes can be suspended along the sides of the tent to hang decorations-you bring the rope. **Nothing should be attached to the canvas of the tents-never, ever. No tape, staples, or pins. Stakes will be charged for any damage.**

DO NOT MARK, PAINT, OR ATTACH ANYTHING (NO PINS OR TAPE) TO THE TENTS OR DROP-DOWN CANVAS CLOSURES.

SUPERVISION

Groups must be properly supervised at all times. Graffiti, purposeful damage to the camp, discharging of fire extinguishers, etc., will be the responsibility of the group to repair or replace.

IF SUCH DAMAGE OCCURS, THE GROUP RESPONSIBLE WILL CORRECT THE PROBLEM IN THE MANNER THAT THE CAMP MISSIONARIES INSTRUCT, WHICH MAY INCLUDE REPAIRS & FINANCIAL COMPENSATION.

TRAILS

A variety of short, long, easy, and difficult trails originate from the camp. For maps of the trails, contact the Camp Missionaries. Walkie-talkies are available for leaders to use on the trails so they can keep in touch. Hikers from Orchard and Rimview camps please be respectful of campers at Main Camp when walking to the trailhead. Use the upper road by Main Camp Archery avoiding walking through Main Camp by the lodge.

“LOOK WITH WONDER TRAIL” is a short forest stroll featuring the Young Women Values, lined with inspirational quotes, leading to a quiet clearing/sitting area and a beautiful statue, “Close to Heaven,” by Scott Streadbeck. It is in Main Camp near the Creekside Retreat but is available to all. Orchard and Rimview Camps are to make advance arrangements with the leaders at Main Camp to visit this trail.

AMERICAL FLAG

Each camp area has a flagpole and a flag. Flags are stored in the following locations: Main Camp-cleaning supply room; Orchard Camp-Nurse’s room; Rimview Camp-Laundry room.

CANOES

The Camp has 6 canoes (each holding two individuals), oars, and life vests. They may be scheduled for **one day out of your stay**. Prior to camp, schedule and pay online by scrolling down on your reservation page until you see “Amenities-Water.” There is no body of water at the Camp. Your group will need to take the canoes elsewhere. A truck with a 2” tow hitch is required.

ARCHERY EQUIPMENT

Bows, arrows, arm guards & targets are available- \$25 rental fee per camp day. Prior to camp, schedule and pay online by scrolling down on your reservation page until you see “Amenities-Sports” Each camp area has its own archery range. When a stake brings its own equipment, there is no fee to use the range

SENDING MAIL TO CAMP

Plan ahead. Mail takes 2-3 days to reach Pine. **Before you arrive, inform the Missionaries you are expecting mail as they must make time to go to the Pine Post Office to pick it up.**
