CAMP LO MIA FIRE PRECAUTIONS AND EVACUATION PLANS

THIS INFORMATION IS TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO EVERY ADULT ATTENDING YOUR EVENT.

*Camp Lo Mia is a recreational property blessed and dedicated to the Lord
for the edification of our young women.
Caring for it properly is a responsibility we all share.*

Arizona is experiencing a record breaking drought.

Camp personnel are, and will continue to be, in close contact with the Pine Fire Department.

It is imperative that campers be attentive and vigilant while at the camp to a **prevent forest fires**. It is also important that all leaders be aware of **camp's evacuation plans**.

Camp Activities

- During events and hikes, be alert to any situation that may cause sparks. Even the friction of rocks hitting rocks can create a spark. Be watchful and aware of your surroundings.
- Private vehicles, ATVs and UTVs must stay on dirt/ gravel roads.
- Place generators on gravel or dirt away from brush.
- Chuck wagons/cooking grills/smokers may only be used when fueled by propane. No wood or charcoal is to be burned at camp. Park on gravel or dirt only.
- Box fans may be used to cool cabins/kitchens/sleeping quarters. Do not leave them unattended; unplug when not in use. Curling irons and hair dryers should always be unplugged when not in use.

Fire Extinguishers

- Fire extinguishers are located in every kitchen, cabin, addie, room and tent. They are not toys and must remain operational. Cabin leader should check the pressure each day. When necessary, ask missionaries for a replacement extinguisher. The stake/ward/group will be charged a \$20 replacement fee for each extinguisher misused.
- Larger fire extinguishers are located at each kitchen building.
- In Main Camp the extinguisher is mounted on the corner of the Lodge near the BBQ
- In Orchard and Rimview Camps, they are next to the side doors, near the BBQs.

Fire Alarms

The camp has 3 fire alarms-located in each camp's kitchen buildings. The lodge and kitchen buildings are to remain unlocked during camp stay.

- Main Camp lodge-inside the dining room next to double doors.
- Orchard Camp kitchen-inside kitchen next to the east door.
- Rimview Camp kitchen-inside kitchen next to the west door.

Emergency Procedures

- A fire drill will be part of your camp stay.
- As close to your arrival as possible, a leader must record the names of each person occupying that cabin, addie, tent, room on the form(s) contained in the pouch located within the structure.
- When an emergency alarm sounds in any camp, everyone on the camp property goes immediately to their designated evacuation area.
- In such an emergency, the leader procures the pouch containing the names of those in their cabin, takes it to the designated evacuation area and accounts for each occupant on the list.
- Kitchen Crews-Turn off ovens and evacuate to specified area.

Evacuation Plan

It is imperative that the instructions of the Camp Missionaries be followed. They have been set apart to care for camp guests and the camp property.

Evacuation areas:

- Main Camp-gather in the field behind the lodge.
- Orchard Camp-gather at the baseball field, then proceed across the bridge to the field behind the missionaries' home.
- Rimview Camp-proceed down the hill and gather in the field behind the missionaries' home.
- No one is to leave the camp in private cars. The road into the camp must remain clear for campers to exit and for emergency vehicles to get in and out.
- Do not use forest trails to exit the camp.

Groups will be led on foot out of the camp by missionaries or assigned leaders. Exit on Pine Creek Canyon Rd. to the LDS Chapel at the corner of Pine Creek Canyon Rd. and Hwy 87.

In an emergency situation, the Missionaries are the authorities in charge and responsible for decisions. Follow instructions given by Camp Lo Mia Missionaries, Pine Fire, Police and/or Forestry Departments.
